Children's Emotional Self-Regulation: Influences of Parental Mental Health & Parenting Style

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Background

School readiness & emotional self-regulation = school success



Social & behavioral issues can lead to poor academic outcomes Delays in emotional selfregulation skills → academic & social difficulties



(Blair, 2002; Mathis & Bierman, 2015; McClelland et al., 2006; Walker & MacPhee, 2011)



Emotional Self-Regulation (ESR):



Processes used to change emotional state, to prevent or initiate emotional responding, and regulate behavioral expression of emotion



Parental Stress:

General stress and/or stressors that accompany parenting











Current Study

Parental mental health/well-being

Parenting style & ESR modeling Parental stress & child behavior problems





Hypothesis:

Underlying implicit and explicit parental stress contributes to negatively developed ESR in children which can adversely affect their readiness to attend school





Parental Mental Health & Children's ESR



Maternal depression & children's behavior problems (Goodman et al., 2011)

Children of depressed mothers = limited ESR strategies (Silk et al., 2006)





Parenting Style & Children's ESR


Family context affects development of children's ER in 3 ways: (Morris et al., 2007)

- 1. Observation and parental modeling
- 2. Parenting practices and behaviors
- 3. Emotional climate of family (including parenting style)





